Our children's classrooms are abuzz with the sound of love, laughter, and learning. Approximately 25 adults and youth care for and teach infants through 5th graders each Sunday. Thank you for focusing your time, energy, and love for Jesus on children here at NFC. Your faithfulness is life-changing for the students and their families.

Operation Christmas Child

Each year individuals and families participate in Operation Christmas Child by filling shoeboxes with gifts for children living in impoverished countries. These gifts bring delight, and Samaritan's Purse makes sure they include an opportunity to learn about Jesus Christ. We will be collecting shoeboxes filled with toiletries, toys, candy, and craft supplies on November 24 at our annual Thanksgiving service at Bauman Auditorium. Please include \$7 with every shoebox to pay for shipping. You can give online or you can write a check placed in an envelope in your shoebox to Samaritan's Purse (include OCC on the memo line). Fill an empty shoebox (standard size) or a small plastic container. Wrap the box and lid separately. Wrapping not required. Determine whether your gift is for a boy or girl and what age group it is for, then attach the appropriate label to the top of your box. Your gift brings good news and great joy.

TOYS

small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch A Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, etc.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS

toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

OTHER

Hard candy and lollipops (please double bag all candy), mints, gum, T-shirts, socks, ball caps; sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)

A PERSONAL NOTE

In a separate envelope, you may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. (If you include your name and address, the child may write back.)

Do Not Include:

Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snowglobes or glass containers; aerosol cans

Sunday Morning Schedule
