


Operation Christmas Child Details


- Empty shoeboxes can be found on Sunday mornings in the Resource Room or weekdays in the NFC office.
- The following items can be found at the Welcome Center, on the info tower by the nursery, and in the NFC office: a brochure that includes an envelope for your shipping donation and age/gender labels, an "All About Me" coloring sheet, and a list of 101 shoebox packing ideas.
- You must include \$7 for shipping in your shoebox. Checks are made out to *Samaritan's Purse* with "OCC" in the memo line.
- Make sure the lid is wrapped separately and that the shoebox will open/close. Put marked label on box top. Secure lid with rubber band.
- Do not include liquids (shampoo/ body wash) or things that could melt (chocolates) in the shoeboxes. Hard candies double bagged are OK.
- Drop off is November 23 at the Bauman Thanksgiving service or up until November 21 in the NFC office.
- Duduza dolls to include in your box will be available at the welcome center on Sundays, November 9 and 16—while supply lasts.


